We would never ask you to endorse a candidate from the pulpit; however, we encourage you to ask your congregation to evaluate the candidates for Supreme Court through the lens of Scripture and prayer to help them honor God with their vote.

- Incorporating prayer in the service for the election
- Encouraging, from the pulpit, your church to honor God with their vote
