GOVERNMENT HAS A "SHEPHERD."

God designed and ordained three institutions: the family, the state, and the church. All three institutions have "shepherds." Biblically, fathers shepherd the family, pastors shepherd the local church, and "kings" shepherd government. "Kings" still shepherd our government today. In America, the "king" is no longer just one person, but many different offices. On April 4, 2023, you may vote for "shepherds" at the local level represented by members of school boards, city councils, mayors, circuit court judges, and others. At the state level, you will have the opportunity to determine the future of Wisconsin's judicial branch by electing a new Supreme Court justice.

BUT WHAT KIND OF "SHEPHERD"?

In John 10:7-18, Jesus describes three kinds of leaders: the hireling, the thief, and the "good shepherd." Every leader falls into one of these categories. For government, the hireling is the politician looking to please people and be liked. The thief is the tyrant whose aim is power and personal gain. The "good shepherd" is the statesman/stateswoman who figuratively sacrificially lays down his/her life—often including his/her own career—for the people he/she serves.

GOD'S "SHEPHERDS" OF GOVERNMENT HAVE A HIGHER CALLING.

Jesus is the Head of the Church (Col. 1:8), and He is the head of government. Scripture calls Jesus the "King of kings" (1 Tim 6:15). In 1 Peter 5, Peter calls the elders of the Church to look to Christ as their example, as a sacrificial "shepherd," who lays down his life for the sheep. Today's governing "shepherds" have the same calling—to look to the "King of kings," who gave Himself at the Cross (Phil. 2) for the sake of the people. Jesus turned the world's view of power and leadership upside down, for He is no less the "King of kings" than He is the King of the Church.



"GOOD SHEPHERDS" BRING BLESSINGS TO THE PEOPLE.

Biblical values and righteousness bring life while sin brings death (Deut. 30:15-20). When we choose leaders who bring life and not death, it leads to the blessing of our state. As Christians, we should seek God's wisdom on whom to vote for by evaluating the

candidates' positions in keeping with Scripture and praying for guidance in voting for those who will be "good shepherds" and will bring life throughout Wisconsin.

WE CHOOSE OUR GOVERNING "SHEPHERDS."

In Wisconsin, on April 4, we can choose our non-partisan "shepherds" who will govern us. Christians better than the culture understand the high calling of "shepherds," and our voice is needed to determine who is best to shepherd our communities and state. As Paul stated, "Imitate me as I imitate Christ." As much as possible, Christians need to select leaders who look to Christ as their ultimate example.
