NO GREATER LOVE

In 2001, I traveled with my wife to Hawaii for our 25th wedding anniversary. We were able to spend some time on Oahu where we visited Pearl Harbor and the *Arizona* Memorial. After viewing a film in the visitor's center, we were shuttled via a Navy launch across the harbor to the Memorial. As we stood in the Memorial, which is erected above the sunken *USS Arizona* and saw the names of those who lost their lives on that infamous day in 1941, the weight of the loss settled on us. You could not help but weep for the loss of life that occurred that day, especially with the realization that many were entombed in the bowels of the ship we could see in the water beneath us.

Not many years later we had the privilege of visiting France, where my brother-in-law and his wife were in language school, preparing for missionary service. While there we drove up to Normandy. We stood on that beach where, in 1944, so many made the ultimate sacrifice. It was such a peaceful beautiful day, it was difficult to imagine the carnage that unfolded on that beach decades earlier. Then we visited the American cemetery. There we saw hundreds upon hundreds of perfectly aligned gleaming white stone crosses, marking the graves of those American young men who would never return home to loved ones. And again, we were moved to tears.
